In April a group of us attended AAFP **Annual Chapter Leader Forum (ACLF)**. I attended in addition to **Dr. Joy Mueller, Dr. Ben Meyerink, and Carletta**. Joining us was **Dr. Jesse Nieuwenhuis** who attended, **AAFP National Conference of Constituency Leaders**. This is a great opportunity

to hear how other chapters operate and get ideas of how we can do things differently. We also had the opportunity to get to know the AK, MT and NM chapter leaders.

In May, **Dr. Scott Boyens, Dr. Dan Heinemann, Carletta and I** attended **AAFP Advocacy day in Washington DC**. While there we had the opportunity to meet with staff members of Senators Thune and Rounds in addition to Representative Johnson. This year the AAFP's big talking points involved enacting legislation and providing finances to aid in integrating behavioral health into primary care, removing barriers for telehealth and improved reimbursement for such in addition to working toward increasing access to primary care in Medicaid.

I would encourage everyone to be involved. One thing that we learned through advocating in Pierre and in Washington DC is that our opinion as physicians, as it relates to healthcare, matters. Work toward having a relationship with local representatives and don't hesitate to reach out to our representation nationally. Also, I would encourage everyone to be involved in the SDAFP and its events. You have likely already gotten emails about upcoming KSA offered by SDAFP. If you have never done this in the group setting, give it a try. You will likely be seeing opportunities for events this fall to join with colleagues for fun and will certainly be getting information about our next SDAFP Winter Conference.

Health Occupation Students in America South Dakota Chapter had great representation at the International HOSA Leadership Conference in Nashville, TN earlier this summer. 109 students, all interested in medical careers, joined over 10,600 other high school aged student for a week of competition and fun.

There are six categories of events that students can compete in including health profession competitive events. This category includes but is not limited to biomedical lab science, clinical nursing, dental science, physical therapy and now FAMILY MEDICINE.

The road to the family medicine event took a direct path through SD with Susan Anderson, MD, Brock Rops, State HOSA Advisor and (me) Carletta Hauck, SDAFP Executive Director all serving on an AAFP taskforce to help create the national competitive event.

This was the first year the event was offered and we had a few SD students participate. I got to go to Nashville with the AAFP and help judge the new event. It was an exciting time to be in Nashville with all the energy of so many youthful souls in one place!

There were 40 competitors in the first ever national FM competitive event. I was so impressed with the students and the research they did to create their presentations. There were 4 sets of judges and each had ten student competitors to score. Of the ten students my partner and I

judged, eight of them said they were going to pursue Family Medicine as a career. I was really surprised by that high number, so I asked some of the other judges about their experience and they said they too had a high number of students say there were going to pursue this career.

One highlight of the meeting was the main guest speaker, Family Medicine TikTok superstar Dr. Mike Varshavski. He has had over a billion total views. The students clearly knew who he was and the excitement in the room was energizing!

How can you get involved? Most likely the high school in your location has a HOSA chapter. You can reach out to the local advisors and let them know you are available to help any students wanting to participate in the Family Medicine event. The student needs to interview a FM physician as part of the process.

The White Coat ceremony is a rite held at medical schools across the nation in recognition of the expectations society places on physicians and symbolizes the journey the students are beginning.

The SSOM’s newest class includes 71 students, one of whom is pursuing an M.D./Ph.D. Fifty-two percent of the class is female; 48% are male. Collectively, the class graduated from 19 different colleges--seven from South Dakota, eight from border states and four from non-border states. Their average age is 23.8 years, representing 28 different South Dakota high schools. 41% have a rural background growing up in communities of fewer than 10,000 people and 62% are from a town of fewer than 30,000 people.

The presentation of the white coats was led by **Dr. Lori Hansen**, interim dean of Medical Student Affairs. **Dr. Jerome Freeman**, chair of the SSOM Department of Neurosciences, Dr. April Willman, interim dean of the Yankton campus and Dr. Matthew Simmons, dean of the Rapid City campus, coated the students.

The Class of 2026 was then led in reciting the Affirmation of the Physician by **Dr. Lucio Margallo**, president of the South Dakota State Medical Association. They began their formal medical training in July.



Once again, the **SDAFP** won the **FamMedPAC Chairman’s Award** for having the highest percentage of Club George contributors. To become a Club George Member you must donate 1 dollar a day to the AAFP FamMedPAC. It is the only political action committee dedicated to Family Medicine.

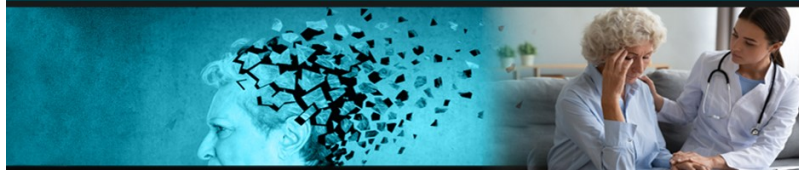
Family Medicine Philanthropic Consortium
